SUMMARY DESCRIPTION

STANDARD REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

PART I – SELECTION PROCEDURES AND REQUIREMENTS

Section 1: Letter of Invitation (LOI)

This Section is a template of a letter from the Client addressed to a shortlisted consulting firm inviting it to submit a proposal for a consulting assignment. The LOI includes a list of all shortlisted firms to whom similar letters of invitation are sent, and a reference to the selection method and applicable guidelines or policies that govern the selection and award process.

Section 2: Instructions to Consultants, Data Sheet

This Section consists of two parts: “Instructions to Consultants” and “Data Sheet”. “Instructions to Consultants” contains provisions that are to be used without modifications. “Data Sheet” contains information specific to each selection and corresponds to the clauses in “Instructions to Consultants” that call for selection-specific information to be added. This Section provides information to help shortlisted consultants prepare their proposals. Information is also provided on the submission, opening and evaluation of proposals, contract negotiation and award of contract.

Section 3: Technical Proposal – Standard Forms

This Section includes the forms that are to be completed by the shortlisted consultants and submitted in accordance with the requirements of Section 2.

Section 4: Financial Proposal – Standard Forms

This Section includes the financial forms that are to be completed by the shortlisted consultants, including the consultant’s costing of its technical proposal, which are to be submitted in accordance with the requirements of Section 2.

Section 5: Eligible Countries

This Section contains information regarding eligible countries.

Section 6: GoN/DP Policy - Fraud and Corruption

This Section provides shortlisted consultants with the reference to the Bank’s policy in regard to corrupt and fraudulent practices applicable to the selection process.

Section 7: Terms of Reference (TORs)

This Section describes the scope of services, objectives, goals, specific tasks required to implement the assignment, and relevant background information; provides details on the required qualifications of the key experts; and lists the expected deliverables. This Section shall not be used to over-write provisions in Section 2.

Section 2: Instructions to Consultants and Data Sheet

A. General Provisions

1. Definitions	<p>(a). "Affiliate(s)" means an individual or an entity that directly or indirectly controls, is controlled by, or is under common control with the Consultant.</p> <p>(b). "Applicable Guidelines" means the policies of the Development Partner (DP) governing the selection and Contract award process, in case of DP funded project. "Applicable Law" means the laws and any other instruments having the force of law in Nepal as they may be issued and in force from time to time.</p> <p>(c). "Borrower [or Recipient or Beneficiary]" means the Government, Government agency or other entity that signs the financing [or loan/credit/grant/project] agreement with the Development Partner.</p> <p>(d). "Client" means the <i>[procuring entity/implementing/ executing agency]</i> that signs the Contract for the Services with the selected Consultant.</p> <p>(e). "Consultant" means a legally-established professional consulting firm or an entity that may provide or provides the Services to the Client under the Contract.</p> <p>(f). "Contract" means a legally binding written agreement signed between the Client and the Consultant and includes all the attached documents listed in its Clause 1 (the General Conditions of Contract (GCC), the Special Conditions of Contract (SCC), and the Appendices).</p> <p>(g). "Data Sheet" means an integral part of the Instructions to Consultants (ITC) Section 2 that is used to reflect specific assignment conditions to supplement, but not to over-write, the provisions of the ITC.</p> <p>(h). "Day" means a calendar day.</p> <p>(i). "Development Partner (DP)" means the country/institution funding the project as specified in the Data Sheet.</p> <p>(j). "Experts" means, collectively, Key Experts, Non-Key Experts, or any other personnel of the Consultant, Sub-consultant or Joint Venture member(s).</p> <p>(k). "Government" means the government of the Nepal.</p> <p>(l). "Joint Venture (JV)" means an association with or without a legal personality distinct from that of its members, of more than one Consultant where one member has the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the JV, and where the members of the JV are jointly and severally liable to the Client for the performance of the Contract.</p> <p>(m). "Key Expert(s)" means an individual professional whose skills, qualifications, knowledge and experience are critical to the performance of the Services under the Contract and whose CV is taken into account in the technical evaluation of the Consultant's proposal.</p>

"ITC" (this Section 2 of the RFP) means the Instructions to Consultants that provides the shortlisted Consultants with all information needed to prepare their Proposals. (o). "LOI" (Section 1 of the RFP) means the Letter of Invitation being sent by the Client to the shortlisted Consultants. (p). "Non-Key Expert(s)" means an individual professional provided by the Consultant or its Sub-consultant and who is assigned to perform the Services or any part thereof under the Contract and whose CVs are not evaluated individually. (q). "Proposal" means the Technical Proposal and the Financial Proposal of the Consultant. (r). "RFP" means the Request for Proposals prepared by the Client for the selection of Consultants, based on the SRFP. (s). "SRFP" means the Standard Request for Proposals issued by PPMO, which must be used by the Public Entity as the basis for the preparation of the RFP. (t). "Services" means the work to be performed by the Consultant pursuant to the Contract. (u). "Sub-consultant" means an entity to whom the Consultant intends to subcontract any part of the Services while remaining responsible to the Client during the performance of the Contract. (v). "TORs" (this Section 7 of the RFP) means the Terms of Reference that explain the objectives, scope of work, activities, and tasks to be performed, respective responsibilities of the Client and the Consultant, and expected results and deliverables of the assignment.
2. Introduction	<p>2.1 The Client named in the Data Sheet intends to select a Consultant from those listed in the Letter of Invitation, in accordance with the method of selection specified in the Data Sheet.</p> <p>2.2 The shortlisted Consultants are invited to submit a Technical Proposal and a Financial Proposal, or a Technical Proposal only, as specified in the Data Sheet, for consulting services required for the assignment named in the Data Sheet. The Proposal will be the basis for negotiating and ultimately signing the Contract with the selected Consultant.</p> <p>2.3 The Consultants should familiarize themselves with the local conditions and take them into account in preparing their Proposals, including attending a pre-proposal conference if one is specified in the Data Sheet. Attending any such pre-proposal conference is optional and is at the Consultants' expense.</p> <p>2.4 The Client will timely provide, at no cost to the Consultants, the inputs, relevant project data, and reports required for the preparation of the Consultant's Proposal as specified in the Data Sheet.</p>
3. Conflict of Interest	<p>3.1 The Consultant is required to provide professional, objective, and impartial advice, at all times holding the Client's interests paramount, strictly avoiding conflicts with other assignments or its own corporate interests, and acting without any consideration for future work.</p> <p>The Consultant has an obligation to disclose to the Client any situation of actual or potential conflict that impacts its capacity to serve the best</p>

	<p>interest of its Client. Failure to disclose such situations may lead to the disqualification of the Consultant or the termination of its Contract and/or blacklisting by the Public Procurement Monitoring Office/DP.</p> <p>Without limitation on the generality of the foregoing, and unless stated otherwise in the Data Sheet, the Consultant shall not be hired under the circumstances set forth below:</p>
a. Conflicting activities	(i) <u>Conflict between consulting activities and procurement of goods, works or non-consulting services</u> : a firm that has been engaged by the Client to provide goods, works, or non-consulting services for a project, or any of its Affiliates, shall be disqualified from providing consulting services resulting from or directly related to those goods, works, or non-consulting services. Conversely, a firm hired to provide consulting services for the preparation or implementation of a project, or any of its Affiliates, shall be disqualified from subsequently providing goods or works or non-consulting services resulting from or directly related to the consulting services for such preparation or implementation.
b. Conflicting assignments	(ii) <u>Conflict among consulting assignments</u> : a Consultant (including its Experts and Sub-consultants) or any of its Affiliates shall not be hired for any assignment that, by its nature, may be in conflict with another assignment of the Consultant for the same or for another Client.
c. Conflicting relationships	(iii) <u>Relationship with the Client's staff</u> : a Consultant (including its Experts and Sub-consultants) that has a close business or family relationship with a professional staff of the Client or are directly or indirectly involved in any part of (i) the preparation of the Terms of Reference for the assignment, (ii) the selection process for the Contract, or (iii) the supervision of the Contract, may not be awarded a Contract.
4. Unfair Competitive Advantage	4.1 Fairness and transparency in the selection process require that the Consultants or their Affiliates competing for a specific assignment do not derive a competitive advantage from having provided consulting services related to the assignment in question. To that end, the Client shall indicate in the Data Sheet and make available to all shortlisted Consultants together with this RFP all information that would in that respect give such Consultant any unfair competitive advantage over competing Consultants.
5. Corrupt and Fraudulent Practices	<p>5.1 The GoN/DP require compliance with its policy in regard to corrupt and fraudulent/prohibited practices as set forth in Section 6.</p> <p>5.2 In further pursuance of this policy, Consultant shall permit and shall cause its sub-consultants and sub-contractors to permit GoN/DP or its representatives to inspect the accounts, records and other documents relating to the submission of the Proposal and execution of the contract, in case of award, and to have the accounts and records audited by auditors appointed by the GoN/DP.</p> <p>5.3 Consultants shall be aware of the provisions on fraud and corruption stated in Clause GCC 10.1.</p>

6. Eligibility	<p>6.1 The GoN/DP permits consultants (individuals and firms, including Joint Ventures and their individual members) from the eligible countries as stated in Section 5 to offer consulting services for GoN/DP-financed projects.</p> <p>6.2 Furthermore, it is the Consultant's responsibility to ensure that its Experts, joint venture members, Sub-consultants, agents (declared or not), sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers and/or their employees meet the eligibility requirements as established by the GoN/DP. Maximum number of partners in JV shall be Specified in Data sheet.</p> <p>6.3 As an exception to the foregoing Clauses 6.1 and 6.2 above:</p>
a. Sanctions	6.3.1 In case of a natural person or firm/institution/company which is already declared blacklisted and ineligible by the GoN, any other new or existing firm/institution/company owned partially or fully by such Natural person or Owner or Board of director of blacklisted firm/institution/company; shall not be eligible consultant. The list of debarred firms and individuals is available at the electronic address specified in the Data Sheet .
b. Prohibitions	<p>6.3.2 Firms and individuals shall have the nationality of an eligible countries as indicated in Section 5 (Eligible Countries) and:</p> <p>(a) as a matter of law or official regulations, Nepal prohibits commercial relations with that country; or</p> <p>(b) by an act of compliance with a decision of the United Nations Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, the Borrower's Country prohibits any import of goods from that country or any payments to any country, person, or entity in that country.</p>
c. Restrictions for public employees	6.3.3 Government officials and civil servants may only be hired under consulting contracts, either as individuals or as members of a team of a consulting firm, if permitted under GoN/DP policy, and their employment would not create a conflict of interest).
B. Preparation of Proposals	
7. General Considerations	7.1 In preparing the Proposal, the Consultant is expected to examine the RFP in detail. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested in the RFP may result in rejection of the Proposal.
8. Cost of Preparation of Proposal	8.1 The Consultant shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its Proposal, and the Client shall not be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the selection process. The Client is not bound to accept any proposal, and reserves the right to annul the selection process at any time prior to Contract award, without thereby incurring any liability to the Consultant.
9. Language	9.1 The Proposal, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Proposal exchanged between the Consultant and the Client, shall be written in the English language.

10. Documents Comprising the Proposal	<p>10.1 The Proposal shall comprise the documents and forms listed in the Data Sheet.</p> <p>10.2 The Consultant shall furnish information on commissions, gratuities and fees, if any, paid or to be paid to agents or any other party relating to this Proposal and, if awarded, Contract execution, as requested in the Financial Proposal submission form (Section 4).</p>
11. Only One Proposal	<p>11.1 The Consultant (including the individual members of any Joint Venture) shall submit only one Proposal, either in its own name or as part of a Joint Venture in another Proposal. If a Consultant, including any Joint Venture member, submits or participates in more than one proposal, all such proposals shall be disqualified and rejected. This does not, however, preclude a Sub-consultant, or the Consultant's staff from participating as Key Experts and Non-Key Experts in more than one Proposal when circumstances justify and if stated in the Data Sheet.</p>
12. Proposal Validity	<p>12.1 The Data Sheet indicates the period during which the Consultant's Proposal must remain valid after the Proposal submission deadline.</p> <p>12.2 During this period, the Consultant shall maintain its original Proposal without any change, including the availability of the Key Experts, the proposed rates and the total price.</p> <p>12.3 If it is established that any Key Expert nominated in the Consultant's Proposal was not available at the time of Proposal submission or was included in the Proposal without his/her confirmation, such Proposal shall be disqualified and rejected for further evaluation, and may be subject to blacklisting in accordance with Clause 5 of this ITC.</p>
a. Extension of Validity Period	<p>12.4 The Client will make its best effort to complete the negotiations within the proposal's validity period. However, should the need arise, the Client may request, in writing, all Consultants who submitted Proposals prior to the submission deadline to extend the Proposals' validity.</p> <p>12.5 If the Consultant agrees to extend the validity of its Proposal, it shall be done without any change in the original Proposal and with the confirmation of the availability of the Key Experts. The Consultant shall not include any additional conditions against the provisions specified in RFP, while extending the validity of its Proposal.</p> <p>12.6 The Consultant has the right to refuse to extend the validity of its Proposal in which case such Proposal will not be further evaluated.</p>
b. Substitution of Key Experts at Validity Extension	<p>12.7 If any of the Key Experts become unavailable for the extended validity period, the Consultant shall provide a written adequate justification and evidence satisfactory to the Client together with the substitution request. In such case, a replacement Key Expert shall have equal or better qualifications and experience than those of the originally proposed Key Expert. The technical evaluation score, however, will remain to be based on the evaluation of the CV of the original Key Expert.</p> <p>12.8 If the Consultant fails to provide a replacement Key Expert with equal or better qualifications, or if the provided reasons for the replacement or justification are unacceptable to the Client, such Proposal will be rejected.</p>
c. Sub-Contracting	12.9 The Consultant shall not subcontract the whole of the Services unless otherwise indicated in the Data Sheet .

13. Clarification and Amendment of RFP	<p>13.1 The Consultant may request a clarification of any part of the RFP during the period indicated in the Data Sheet before the Proposals' submission deadline. Any request for clarification must be sent in writing, or by standard electronic means, to the Client's address indicated in the Data Sheet. The Client will respond in writing, or by standard electronic means, and will send written copies of the response (including an explanation of the query but without identifying its source) to all shortlisted Consultants. Should the Client deem it necessary to amend the RFP as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure described below:</p> <p>13.1.1 At any time before the proposal submission deadline, the Client may amend the RFP by issuing an amendment in writing or by standard electronic means. The amendment shall be sent to all shortlisted Consultants and will be binding on them. The shortlisted Consultants shall acknowledge receipt of all amendments in writing.</p> <p>13.1.2 If the amendment is substantial, the Client may extend the proposal submission deadline to give the shortlisted Consultants reasonable time to take an amendment into account in their Proposals.</p> <p>13.1.3 The Consultant may submit a modified Proposal or a modification to any part of it at any time prior to the proposal submission deadline. No modifications to the Technical or Financial Proposal shall be accepted after the deadline.</p>
14. Preparation of Proposals – Specific Considerations	<p>14.1 While preparing the Proposal, the Consultant must give particular attention to the following:</p> <p>14.1.1 If a shortlisted Consultant considers that it may enhance its expertise for the assignment by associating with other consultants in the form of a Joint Venture or as Sub-consultants, it may do so with either (a) non-shortlisted Consultant(s), or (b) shortlisted Consultants if permitted in the Data Sheet. In all such cases a shortlisted Consultant must obtain the written approval of the Client prior to the submission of the Proposal. When associating with non-shortlisted firms in the form of a joint venture or a sub-consultancy, the shortlisted Consultant shall be a lead member.</p> <p>14.1.2 The Client may indicate in the Data Sheet the estimated Key Experts' time input (expressed in person-month) or the Client's estimated total cost of the assignment. This estimate is indicative and the Proposal shall be based on the Consultant's own estimates for the same.</p> <p>14.1.3 If stated in the Data Sheet, the Consultant shall include in its Proposal at least the same time input (in the same unit as indicated in the Data Sheet) of Key Experts, failing which the Financial Proposal will be adjusted for the purpose of comparison of proposals and decision for award in accordance with the procedure in the Data Sheet.</p> <p>14.1.4 For assignments under the Fixed-Budget selection method, the estimated Key Experts' time input is not disclosed. Total available budget,</p>

	with an indication whether it is inclusive or exclusive of taxes, is given in the Data Sheet , and the Financial Proposal shall not exceed this budget.
15. Technical Proposal Format and Content	<p>15.1 The Technical Proposal shall not include any financial information. A Technical Proposal containing material financial information shall be declared non-responsive.</p> <p>15.2 Only one curriculum vitae (CV) may be submitted for each key expert. If a technical proposal nominates more than one expert for a position, the Client will evaluate all CVs and apply the lowest score for the position.</p>
16. Financial Proposal	16.1 The Financial Proposal shall be prepared using the Standard Forms provided in Section 4 of the RFP. It shall list all costs associated with the assignment, including (a) remuneration for Key Experts and Non-Key Experts, (b) other expenses, (c) provisional sums when applicable indicated in the Data Sheet .
a. Price Adjustment	16.2 For assignments with a duration exceeding 12 months, a price adjustment provision for foreign and/or local inflation for remuneration rates applies if so stated in the Data Sheet .
b. Taxes	16.3 The Consultant and its Sub-consultants and Experts are responsible for meeting all tax liabilities arising out of the Contract. Information on taxes in the Client's country is provided in the Data Sheet .
c. Currency of Proposal	16.4 The Consultant may express the price for its Services in the currency or currencies as stated in the Data Sheet . If indicated in the Data Sheet , the portion of the price representing local cost shall be stated in the Nepalese Rupees.
d. Currency of Payment	16.5 Payment under the Contract shall be made in the currency or currencies in which the payment is requested in the Proposal.
C. Submission, Opening and Evaluation	
17. Submission, Sealing, and Marking of Proposals	<p>17.1 The Consultant shall submit a signed and complete Proposal comprising the documents and forms in accordance with Clause 10 (Documents Comprising Proposal). The submission can be done by mail or by hand. If specified in the Data Sheet, the Consultant has the option of submitting its Proposals electronically.</p> <p>17.2 An authorized representative of the Consultant shall sign the original submission letters in the required format for both the Technical Proposal and, if applicable, the Financial Proposals and shall initial all pages of both. The authorization shall be in the form of a written power of attorney attached to the Technical Proposal.</p> <p>17.3 A Proposal submitted by a Joint Venture shall be signed by all members so as to be legally binding on all members, or by an authorized representative who has a written power of attorney signed by each member's authorized representative.</p> <p>17.4 Any modifications, revisions, interlineations, erasures, or overwriting shall be valid only if they are signed or initialed by the person signing the Proposal.</p> <p>17.5 The signed Proposal shall be marked "ORIGINAL", and its copies marked "COPY" as appropriate. The number of copies is indicated in</p>

	<p>the Data Sheet. All copies shall be made from the signed original. If there are discrepancies between the original and the copies, the original shall prevail.</p> <p>17.6 The original and all the copies of the Technical Proposal shall be placed inside of a sealed envelope clearly marked "TECHNICAL PROPOSAL", "[Name of the Assignment]", reference number, name and address of the Consultant, and with a warning "Do NOT OPEN UNTIL [INSERT THE DATE AND THE TIME OF THE TECHNICAL PROPOSAL SUBMISSION DEADLINE]".</p> <p>17.7 Similarly, the original Financial Proposal (if required for the applicable selection method) shall be placed inside of a sealed envelope clearly marked "FINANCIAL PROPOSAL" followed by the name of the assignment, reference number, name and address of the Consultant, and with a warning "Do NOT OPEN WITH THE TECHNICAL PROPOSAL".</p> <p>17.8 The sealed envelopes containing the Technical and Financial Proposals shall be placed into one outer envelope and sealed. This outer envelope shall bear the submission address, RFP reference number, the name of the assignment, Consultant's name and the address, and shall be clearly marked "Do NOT OPEN BEFORE [insert the time and date of the submission deadline indicated in the Data Sheet]".</p> <p>17.9 If the envelopes and packages with the Proposal are not sealed and marked as required, the Client will assume no responsibility for the misplacement, loss, or premature opening of the Proposal. For QCBS, FBS and LCS, if the Technical and Financial Proposals are not submitted in separate sealed envelopes as required, the Client shall reject the Proposal.</p> <p>17.10 The Proposal or its modifications must be sent to the address indicated in the Data Sheet and received by the Client no later than the deadline indicated in the Data Sheet, or any extension to this deadline. Any Proposal or its modification received by the Client after the deadline shall be declared late and rejected, and promptly returned unopened.</p>
18. Confidentiality	<p>18.1 From the time the Proposals are opened to the time the Contract is awarded, the Consultant should not contact the Client on any matter related to its Technical and/or Financial Proposal. Information relating to the evaluation of Proposals and award recommendations shall not be disclosed to the Consultants who submitted the Proposals or to any other party not officially concerned with the process, until the letter of intent to accept the proposal has been issued to the selected Consultant.</p> <p>18.2 Any attempt by shortlisted Consultants or anyone on behalf of the Consultant to influence improperly the Client in the evaluation of the Proposals or Contract award decisions may result in the rejection of its Proposal, and may be subject to the application of prevailing PPMO's blacklisting procedures.</p> <p>18.3 Notwithstanding the above provisions, from the time of the Proposals' opening to the time of issuance of notification for opening of financial proposal or the Letter of Intent, if a Consultant wishes to contact the</p>

	Client on any matter related to the selection process, it should do so only in writing.
19. Opening of Technical Proposals	<p>19.1 The Client's evaluation committee shall conduct the opening of the Technical Proposals in the presence of the shortlisted Consultants' authorized representatives who choose to attend. The opening date, time and the address are stated in the Data Sheet. The envelopes with the Financial Proposal shall remain sealed and shall be securely stored until they are opened in accordance with Clause 23 of the ITC.</p> <p>19.2 At the opening of the Technical Proposals the following shall be read out: (i) the name and the country of the Consultant or, in case of a Joint Venture, the name of the Joint Venture, the name of the lead member and the names and the countries of all members; (ii) the presence or absence of a duly sealed envelope with the Financial Proposal; (iii) any modifications to the Proposal submitted prior to proposal submission deadline; and (iv) any other information deemed appropriate or as indicated in the Data Sheet.</p>
20. Proposals Evaluation	<p>20.1 Subject to provision of Clause 15.1 of the ITC, the evaluators of the Technical Proposals shall have no access to the Financial Proposals until the technical evaluation is concluded and the DP issues its "no objection", if applicable.</p> <p>20.2 The Consultant is not permitted to alter or modify its Proposal in any way after the proposal submission deadline except as permitted under Clause 12.7 of this ITC. Section 6: Corrupt and Fraudulent Practices

Section 7: Terms of Reference

Background:

Nepal has a population of 29.19 million with 0.93 growth rates⁴. In 2021, the estimated number of people living with HIV was 40,341 and the adult HIV prevalence was estimated to be 0.12%. The epidemic in Nepal is driven by injecting drug use and sexual transmission, and is categorized as a “concentrated epidemic”. The key populations for HIV transmissions in Nepal are: 1. People who inject drugs (PWID) 2. Sex workers and their clients (male and female) 3. Men having sex with Men (MSM) and Transgender (TG) 4. Male Labor Migrants and their wives 5. Prison Inmates

As of 15 July, 2021, there are 25,214 alive PLHIV in Nepal. The male female sex ratio among HIV positive cases is 1.07. 71.4% of the total alive populations are from the age group 25-49 yrs. HIV transmission seems to be occurring within these groups or networks of individuals who have unsafe and unprotected sexual behavior. Therefore, there is a greater need to focus on the key population (KP) for prevention of HIV in Nepal.

Not all migrants are at risk, so it is important to clearly define and target those migrants who are at risk for HIV infection (e.g. migrants to high HIV prevalence districts in India).

Targeted interventions (TI) are a resource-effective way to implement HIV prevention programs in settings with concentrated HIV epidemics. Targeted interventions are aimed at offering prevention and care services to specific populations within communities by providing them with the information, means and skills they need to minimize HIV transmission and improving their access to care support and treatment services. The best-designed programs also improve sexual and reproductive health and improve general health. Implementing TIs does not negate the need for broader interventions in the community. In many settings, it optimizes the use of resources by focusing on the environments and populations in which the risk of HIV infection is the greatest. Targeted interventions:

- Are for people within the community who are most at risk of HIV infection and involves them in service delivery.
- Are adapted to be culturally and socially appropriate to the target audience.
- Focus limited resources on the most cost-effective interventions and where they can be used to the best benefit.
- Effectively use the language and culture of the people at the center
- Acknowledge that barriers to accessing health-care services exist for some populations within communities.
- Acknowledge that people who are at risk of HIV infection are often marginalized from the broader community, stigmatized and discriminated against.

National HIV program has decided to continue TI activities in order to scale up coverage and quality of HIV and AIDS prevention interventions targeted at Key Affected Population (KAP). Health office intends to apply a portion of these funds to contract the services of qualified NGO/organization for the delivery of a defined package of services for migrants aimed at controlling and preventing the spread of HIV through safe sex, including condom promotion, peer education, treatment of sexually transmitted infections (STI) and voluntary testing and treatment services.

The contract till **30th Jestha 2080** will cover the expected activities within the district. The selected organization(s) will have considerable autonomy in deciding service delivery mechanisms to achieve project objectives. Payments will be made primarily on the success of the organization(s) in making progress towards the process indicators. Sources of data for judging progress will include the management information system. Achievement of results on the ground will be considered of primary importance.

Objectives of the Assignment:

The main objective of this contract is to control and prevent the spread of HIV in migrants and their spouses in district.

The specific objectives are:

- i) 70% of migrants and 80% of spouse of migrants at risk in working area are reached with prevention interventions.
- ii) 90% of migrants and spouses reached with prevention interventions will be tested for HIV and know their status,
- iii) Link and enroll all diagnosed HIV positive and TB people to care, support and treatment.

The implementing NGO will provide the following package of services to high risk migrants and their spouses considering source, transit and destination locations.

1. **Implement behavior change communication interventions at source and transit points to increase safer sex through an outreach program.**
 - Develop a pre-departure orientation program to meet health and safety needs of migrants and potential migrants.
 - Hire and train outreach workers. Include returning/returned migrants, spouses of migrants and PLHIV with a minimum qualification and experience.
 - Train outreach workers to build skills of migrants in proper condom use and disposal, HIV awareness, STI & HTC knowledge and recognition skills.
 - The materials and activities should include education on condom and skills, sexual health and STIs and HTC. Educational and skills building material should be adopted for BCC.

-
- Develop mobile information booths for use at or near bus stations in special occasions
 - Review and revise strategies and activities based on project implementation experience, behavioral surveillance results and in light of issues raised during review.

2. Provide HIV Testing (HTC) services

- Provide HTC services to migrants and their spouses through community-based testing /or mobile clinics.
- Sensitize staff at nearby government HTC centers towards the needs of migrants and their spouses
- Ensure enrolment of HIV positive cases to ARV treatment centers
- TB screening of people diagnosed as HIV positive.

3. Provide condom and skills in use and negotiation

- Ensure that condoms easily available in the project area
- Promote condom use through free distribution of condoms through condom outlets, outreach workers, static and mobile STI/HTC clinics.
- Provide skills in condom use and disposal through outreach workers and include in materials developed for behavior change intervention
- Review and revise condom education and distribution activities based on project experience and behavioral surveillance results

4. Promote an enabling environment to reduce stigma and support program implementation

- Identify potential groups or individuals who could hinder progress of project. Develop a plan to promote a more positive environment for HIV prevention activities among migrants and their spouses specifically tackling stigma.
- Undertake advocacy and educational activities to improve understanding of local police officials and other community members towards the importance of working with migrants for HIV prevention.
- Include anti-stigma messages in media campaigns

5. HIV awareness and publicity to migrants going to abroad via major boarder check posts

- Develop a pre-departure orientation program to meet health and safety needs of abroad migrants
- Mobilize outreach workers to orient abroad migrant in major boarder check posts of Province 1
- Develop/update/revise the HIV component in the orientation package by collaborating with concerned department of GoN
- Educational and skills building materials to abroad migrants adopted for BCC.
- Develop mobile information booths for use at boarder check post.

Staffing: In addition to program staff, the NGO will be required to have Project Coordinator, M&E Officer and Admin/Finance Officer.

Monitoring: The implementing NGO(s) will provide the progress reports against the process indictors defined in M & E Matrix. In addition, district will judge progress

towards achieving the targets described in M & E Matrix, by examining whether the NGO is demonstrating progress towards accomplishing milestones described below. Any decision to terminate the contract or take other remedial action, specified in the contract will be based on past progress of the NGO, the existence of extraneous constraints, challenges, or impediments, a summary of all available quantitative information, and the latest results of integrated biological and behavioral surveys.

Milestone by the end of the first month:

- i) All project staff have been recruited and trained in the basic principles of HIV interventions for migrants and their spouses.
- ii) Specific staff member is delegated and trained to conduct advocacy for an enabling environment; an advocacy program is begun with key stakeholders.
- iii) At least a few returned migrants regularly advise project staff or are included on the staff in a defined position that contributes to decision-making.
- iv) Basic infrastructure, i.e. transportation and main office, are completed.
- v) Criteria for recruitment of all program staff including peer educators and outreach worker/peer educator manuals will be adopted.
- vi) Specific staff member is delegated and trained for M&E; needed computer programs are installed and operating.
- vii) Knowledge and skills in the technical aspects of STI management and HTC for migrants are improved with appropriate technical assistance.
- viii) Infrastructure, i.e. computer programs, clinics, safe spaces, drug supplies, are secured and operating.
- ix) Outreach worker and Peer Educator training has begun with required number of outreach workers and peer educators.
- x) All staff are trained in the principles and practices of behavior change interventions and non-discrimination, including medical staff and auxiliary staff, such as drivers; this training should include issues relating to empowerment and social inclusion.
- xi) Materials (printed, video, audio, musical, etc.) used in discussions among migrants and their spouses are adopted.
- xii) M&E framework completed, including indicators for coverage, exposure to intervention and changes in safer sex behaviors, STI treatment seeking behaviors, quality of STI care and effectiveness, of advocacy for an enabling environment

Compliance with National Guidelines The executing NGO (and its subcontractors) will follow the MoHP/NCASC's National Standard Service Package for HIV Services 2019 and all other relevant national guidelines/SOPs for delivery of services to migrants and all other relevant national guidelines/SOPs for delivery of services to migrants and their spouses.

Facilities that will be provided by the Health Directorate: The Health directorate through the health office will provide the following facilities to the successful NGO during the execution of the contract:

- Technical support including different package (training, orientation, media message) development
- Provide constructive feedback with regular monitoring and supportive supervision.

Accountability and Working Relationship: The NGO will be accountable to Health Directorate for the satisfactory delivery of the services defined here. They will work in close collaboration with the other relevant development partners, and other NGOs working with migrants and their spouses.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The Consultant shall submit reports to the Client as follows:

1. Submit monthly progress report and financial report by using the standard reporting format within 10th of succeeding month (Nepali calendar).
2. Share copy of each report with respective districts and local level.
3. Submit final project reports both progress and financial within the 1 week of project completion to Health Directorate.

In addition, the minimum recording and reporting requirements will be as follows:

- (i) The NGO's staff will maintain a daily log of their activities in sufficient detail to allow a review and assessment by the supervisory personnel.
 - (ii) The number of clients per day using the services and the regularity of clients in using services.
 - (iii) The record that includes number of activities and beneficiary or participant should be maintained and reported.
 - (iv) The number of clients per day using the services and the regularity of clients in using services.
 - (v) Maintenance of stock registers to allow monitoring and reporting of stock-outs of essential commodities
 - (vi) Maintain income and expenditure statements of the project proceeds for external financial audit and provide copy of the audit report to the client or its representative within three months after the completion of a fiscal year.

 - Progress made in against the established target/output target(s)
